Daughter Katie and her partner, Tom, as well as Tom's young daughter Mathilda, sent me a box of wonderful gifts for my recent birthday.

The box contained a pair of earrings that are small globes filled with dandelion seeds - I love them because dandelions are the most persistent thing I know ... they remind us we should never allow anything to stop us from growing!

The box also contained a birthday card ... whose verse from Shakespeare I was enchanted by and so I have included it in this newsletter under "Links from the Prayer Chain" on Page 3, so you can ponder it as well.

And then there was a small book ... a more typical gift from these two adults who are writers themselves ... a book titled *Citizen - An American Lyric* by Claudia Rankine, chancellor of the Academy of American Poets and who teaches at Pomona College.

It is a book of poetry/prose by an African-American woman who writes about her day-to-day life as a black person in America ... and as one reviewer wrote: "It's the best note in the wrong song that is America ... its realities are almost too much to bear, but you bear them because it's the truth."

The book, a National Book Award Finalist, has some startling, insightful passages. Here's one:

"The world is wrong. You can't put the past behind you. It's buried in you; it's turned your flesh into its own cupboard. Not everything remembered is useful but it all comes from the world to be stored in you ... Did that just come out of my mouth, his mouth, your mouth? Do you remember when you sighed?"




