## Mission Opportunities

**Cahoots Teen Coffee House** - This coffeehouse is located at 218 W. Maumee St. and provides a safe place for youth to "hang out" and fill their time with fun and healthy activities. On the weekend, Cahoots hosts a free open-mic night to all musicians, unless they've scheduled a concert featuring touring musicians! Cahoots has a full line of coffee beverages, lunch and snacks. Volunteers from our church include: Marj Lilley, board member; and Lauralee MacLeod and Mark Elliott, mentoring program. **Mason House of Hope** - The site of the CHOICE Program, which offers post-high school training to special-needs young adults through the Northeast Special Education Co-Op.

The clinic's director is our own Dr. Teresa Smith, supported by many volunteers from our church and others. The clinic offers medical care to those who are uninsured in our community.

## Trine MLK Event February 7



On Friday, February 7, Trine University will host its 29th annual celebration of the life and legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Themed “Unity is Our Greatest Strength,” the celebration will begin at 7 p.m. Feb. 7 in Ryan Concert Hall of the T. Furth Center for Performing Arts. Mayor Hickman and Trine University’s Multicultural Student Organization (advised by Deb McHenry and participants in the FCUCC Diversity Sunday) will participate in the program. ## Church Refreshments 2020

The purpose of Fellowship Hour, following Sunday Worship is to get together and share conversation with each other. It is not to provide a meal, although we all enjoy the snacks. With that in mind, we are looking to **SIMPLIFY** how refreshments are provided, making it easier and less costly. So, look for a change later in January as to how refreshments will be scheduled. Folks will be placed into 8 different groups, with the “snowbirds” being dispersed evenly among them. Each group will provide refreshments approx. every two months, dropping them off in the kitchen prior to Worship. An email (phoning if needed) will be sent out at the beginning of the week asking each person/family in the assigned group to bring **just one item** for the following Sunday. No one person will be in charge of the group — and whatever arrives will be the refreshments for that Sunday. If someone happens to be ill or out of town that particular Sunday, other items donated from the group should be enough. We understand there will be no guarantees as to what will be there each Sunday. (*Think of the surprise!*) Let’s give this a try and see how it goes.
